## Other Business

• Licensing Fee

A challenge was highlighted for overseas athletes being expected to pay a licensing fee to the International Basketball Federation (FIBA). This fee has been in place for around 10 years but British Basketball are proposing that backdated costs are paid by any eligible athletes. This rule is also being applied to amateur athletes instead of only professional athletes moving to play in other countries. It was noted that clubs will be invoiced directly by FIBA and basketballscotland will endeavour to support clubs.
