Players not being able to pay fees (because the cost of facilities is rising) basketballscotland followed up with clubs to gain a better understanding of facility issues. We are also following up with 35 clubs who have requested specific support from us and a report will be prepared for a future Board meeting. Referee Updates Local league teams were struggling to get referees for their games. There have been courses for both Lothian and Strathclyde in the last 2 weeks, therefore, some steps are being taken to rectify this. Refereeing Culture Referee engagement has improved, with 78% of our referees looking to mentor. Gladiators Collaboration Agreement The draft agreement was approved by the Board and an operational agreement is being drafted to set out proper plans and timescales. Finance Update Budgets are being reviewed with the Accountants, with end of quarter management accounts being drawn up prior to the end of 2023.
